LIVE LESSONS

ONLINE LEARNING EXPECTATIONS



I am sure that you have heard the recent Government announcements about the importance of children continuing their education, despite the most recent school closures. Teachers are working incredibly hard to ensure all children have access to virtual learning in their Google Classroom for Years 1 - 6 and via Tapestry for our Reception Classes. Please support us by logging in each day and encouraging the children to take part in their lessons. We know that many of

you are juggling working from home as well as home-schooling and we are VERY grateful for your support. It makes an incredible difference and will help us ensure absolute minimum gaps for pupils when they return. If you do not have access to a PC or Laptop, please see the recent information sent home about how to utilise Playstations and XBOX game consoles to access our

Google Classrooms. iPads can also be used. Class teachers are in online classrooms 5 days a week and respond to work as it comes in. They are there to support any misconceptions and answer any questions you have. They also LOVE hearing from their classes, so please do encourage the children to communicate as much as possible. If you are finding a particular barrier to online learning, please do get in touch so that we can help.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS - VOUCHERS

We hope our Free School Meal families are benefiting from the Tesco Giftcards that have been distributed over the last two weeks when your child has not been at school. We are pleased to announce that as of **18th January 2021** we will be moving over to the national voucher scheme that is managed by Edenred on behalf of the Department for Education.



This will mean that you will have a choice of 10 supermarkets to spend your £15 per child voucher. We have been informed that vouchers can be ordered up until half term. We will arrange for the vouchers to be distributed in the same way as the Tesco gift cards.

WELCOME TO THE MAKATON SIGN OF THE WEEK



Each week, we will be bringing you a 'Makaton Sign of the Week'. Makaton uses signs and symbols to help people communicate. It supports the development of essential communication skills such as attention and listening, comprehension, memory, recall and organisation of language and expression. In school,

we use a lot of Makaton when we sing and when we talk to one another. In order to keep promoting and using Makaton, we will include a Makaton Sign of the Week for the children (and adults!) to learn and use. The lovely Mrs Deaves will model it for you.

This week's sign is 'work.'

Put your non-dominant hand diagonally in front of your stomach, with your thumb facing up. Then place your dominant hand (writing hand) on top, facing the opposite direction. Make a sawing action by moving your hands. This can be used with the 'good' sign for when your child has produced good work in class or at home.



STEM CHALLENGE

STEM refers to Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics.

SCIENCE WITH ICE

1 TRY THIS INDOORS ICE RESCUE

Place a small plastic toy or figure (Lego works well) into the container and fill to almost the top with water. Leave in a freezer or ice compartment in the fridge until the water is frozen. Remove the container and leave for 5-10 minutes until the ice loosens and then tip it out onto a plate or tray.

WHAT DO YOU NOTICE? Things to talk about ...

What happens when you pour a little bit of warm water onto the ice? What happens if you put salt onto the ice? What do you think would be the fastest way to rescue your toy from the ice? What could you do to find out? Are bigger toys easier to rescue from the ice than smaller toys?



You will need

- * A container
- * Small plastic toy
- * Water
- * Freezer (or ice compartment in the fridge)
- * Salt
- * Warm water
- * Ice cubes

3. Best school nature area


Battle of the schools, which school can create a wildlife area to be proud of and the winning school would win £100 for their school.








YEAR 1 LEARNING






YEAR 3 LEARNING


YEAR 4 LEARNING

 We should reuse because it will make the earth clean and tidy, also save our health.



<p>Fish: These creatures have scales and breathe water. They use gills to breathe. They have fins and lay their eggs in water.</p> <p>Birds: These animals have two legs and a beak. They have feathers and wings. Some birds are able to fly and others are they are eggs on land.</p> <p>Insects: These animals do not have eyes work while their body is divided into 3 parts. Some insects have six legs. Some insects lay their eggs in cells.</p> <p>Mammals: These animals have hair or fur and breathe air through their lungs. They feed milk to their young and are warm-blooded.</p> <p>Amphibians: These animals live on land or in water. They are cold-blooded and use gills to live. To breathe air, they use lungs. They have an head skeleton and jointed legs for walking.</p> <p>Arachnids: These animals have an exoskeleton covering their body. Their body is made up of three parts: the head, thorax and abdomen. They have a pair of antennae on the top of their head.</p>
